This public area features two of the greatest Union Pacific Railroad locomotives and a vast overlook of the Missouri River Valley.

2 Dr. C.C. and Mabel L. Criss Memorial Foundation Parking Garden

This unique parking facility greets visitors with trees, grasses and ponds.

3 Arrival Garden

This garden sets the stage for what lies ahead with trees, shrubs, perennials and colorful annuals that change with the season.

(4) Festival Garden

This garden features brightly colored perennials, annuals and woody plants.

(5) WOODLAND WATERFALL

This small waterfall of limestone is settled in a natural opening in the valley and surrounded by hardwood trees, a mulch path and benches.

(6) HITCHCOCK-KOUNTZE VICTORIAN GARDEN

A dramatic combination of English and Victorian garden styles is enhanced by historic architectural remnants from the area.

(7) ENGLISH PERENNIAL BORDER

Nearly 300 different species and cultivars are displayed here to create masses of colorful plants in an informal design.

(8) Tree Peony Garden

An extensive collection of Chinese and Japanese tree and herbaceous peonies

Garden In The Glen

Recognized by the American Hosta Society as a national hosta display garden, this garden is filled with an abundance of shade-loving plants.

(10) Arboretum and Oberman Bird Sanctuary

This four-acre site represents several regional plant communities and acts as a home to a diverse number of bird species.


(11) Model Railroad Garden

This enchanted garden features model trains running through a miniature world of structural elements created from natural materials.

(12) ROBERT H. STORZ FAMILY ROSE GARDEN

This formal display features nearly 2,000 rose plants and a working sundial.
